



Story Problem 1:

- (a) In a jungle, there were 3 monkeys on the ground and 5 monkeys on trees. How many total monkeys are there?
- (b) Two monkeys climbed on the tree from the ground. How many monkeys are there on the ground now?
- (c) All the monkeys on the tree plucked two mangoes each. How many mangoes were plucked?
- (d) The single monkey on the ground was Bintu. Bintu was sad that he does not have any mangoes. Seeing this, three of his friends threw down one mango each. How many mangoes does Bintu have now?
- (e) What kind of friend would you like to be? Like one of the three that shared their mango or the others who did not share. How many monkeys did not share their mango?

Story Problem 2:

- (a) There are four mango trees. Three monkeys were up on each tree. How many monkeys are there on the scene?
- (b) A python was seen on the right most tree. The monkeys who were on that tree jumped off and each monkey climbed a different tree. How many monkeys are there on each tree?
- (c) Were the monkeys silly to get scared? Or did they do the right thing? Bintu monkey thought the python was 2 meters long. Chintu monkey thought the python was 200 meters long. Who do you think is correct?
- (d) Chintu monkey says "I made a mistake earlier. The python is 200 cm long". Do you think he is correct? Is he saying the same length as Bintu?
